

Remembering, Listening, Learning: An opportunity to visit the National Holocaust Centre and Museum



Wednesday 5th October, 2016

This day presents an engaging and interactive day, unique to U3A members, which enables shared learning and the opportunity to create and reflect. The day will explore the history of the Holocaust, and consider lessons it may present to society today through considering the question:

Is there anything that can be learned from the Holocaust?

Members will have the opportunity to participate in tours of the exhibitions and discussion, in addition to attending workshops led by experienced educators. The most memorable aspect of the day will, undoubtedly, be the opportunity to listen to the testimony of a Holocaust survivor. As the programme has been designed to enable opportunities for discussion and participation, members may wish to re-visit the exhibitions on a second visit – return visits are included within the admission cost.

The Programme of the day starts at 10.00am and includes:

Tea and coffee on arrival

Introduction to the day, including a brief historical context

Tour of the Holocaust exhibition and Journey exhibition, including a short workshop considering memory and personal history

Lunch

A choice of workshop, one to be chosen from:

Art and the Holocaust

Faith and the Holocaust

Challenges for today

Sharing of the testimony of a survivor of the Holocaust

Introduction to the Memorial gardens, and an opportunity to reflect on what has been considered and learnt through the day

The day concludes at 4.00pm


The cost per delegate is £20 to include:
